Problem

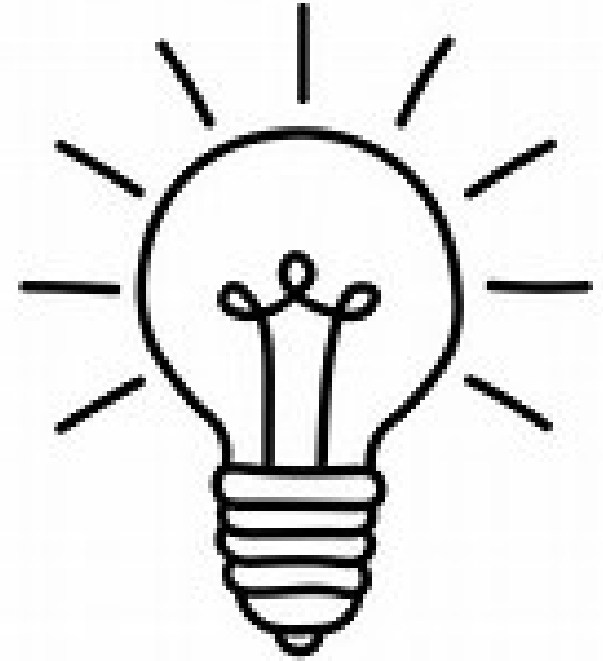
What is the problem you are tackling? Prove it!

- External data – local statistics, quotes from organisations, local authority reports
- Your own data – community surveys, beneficiary surveys, attendance figures
- Gap analysis – what other organisations work in a similar field? Are you copying services or filling a gap?

Solution

What are you doing to tackle the problem?

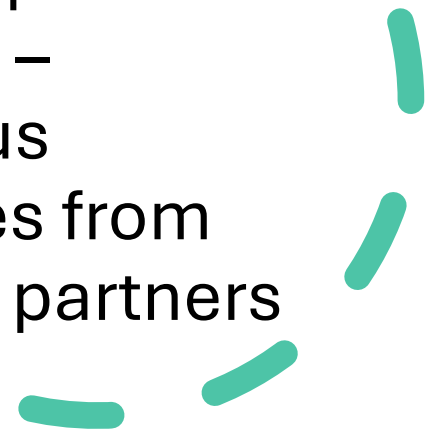
- Who are your beneficiaries?
- Day, time and frequency of support
- Who is responsible for delivering support – staff, volunteers
- Safeguarding





Impact

- What are the outcomes from your work?
- How will you prove you have met those outcomes? – surveys, assessments, data
- Why are you best placed to deliver this work? – Expertise, previous successes, quotes from beneficiaries and partners



Ask

- Direct
- Budget
- How will you sustain the project at the end of the grant?
- Your current financial situation
